## **Description of first aid measures**

#### **General notes:**

# Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

## Acute symptoms and effects:

Dermal exposure may cause an allergic skin reaction. Symptoms may include irritation, redness, pain, rash, inflammation, itching, burning and dermatitis.
